50TH ANNIVERSARY EVENTS IN 2025

SEARAC has several events scheduled throughout 2025 commemorating the 50th anniversary of Southeast Asian American refugee resettlement. Your sponsorship enables us to bring our 50-year celebration to diverse SEAA communities across the country and to build power for the next 50 years.

Documentary film series launch

In partnership with the Center for Asian American Media (CAAM), SEARAC is producing a **series of five documentary short films** uplifting SEAA individuals and organizations, exploring what it means to be Southeast Asian American and American today. This celebration of our community's collective power will be launched at **CAAM Fest in Oakland, CA, in May 2025.**

Nationwide film screenings

Throughout 2025, SEARAC will host **in-person and virtual film screenings** at sites across the US, bringing together film subjects, community leaders, elected officials, and the team behind the series to discuss the topics and themes explored in the series.

Executive Director convening

In April, **SEARAC** will bring together the leadership of more than 30 Southeast Asian American-led and -serving organizations to Washington, DC, to coordinate our efforts to fight back against deportation; to protect Federal wins on data equity, healthcare, and education; and to introduce a national resolution commemorating 50 years of Southeast Asian refugee resettlement.

State and National resolutions for the 50th anniversary

On Capitol Hill and in the California Legislature, SEARAC will lead the effort to **introduce resolutions commemorating the 50th anniversary since our community's arrival to the United States**. These resolutions are powerful opportunities for state and national legislators to acknowledge and uplift the history, resilience, and contributions of Southeast Asian Americans – the largest group of refugees to have ever resettled in the country.

Leadership and Advocacy Training

Since 1999, SEARAC has trained more than 1,400 students, community leaders, and allies through our Leadership and Advocacy Training (LAT). Participants learn to harness the power of their own personal journeys to inspire communities and to engage elected officials to action. Alumni go on to work as advocates, organizers, service providers, and policymakers in their local communities. LAT 2025 will take place in Washington, DC, from June 24-26, 2025.
